## **Transfer Authorization Code (TAC) Updates**

## Transfer Policy Review PDP WG Final Report (PDF)

- The Authinfo Code process has been updated as follows:
  - Name change to Transfer Authorization Code (TAC)
  - The TAC is only created when the registrant requests it, not upon registration
  - There is a standard minimum complexity requirement
  - The TAC has a TTL (time to live) of 336 hours (14 days), it does not exist not forever
    - If the TAC has not been used by the end of that period then it expires
    - The TAC can be nullified (canceled) by the Registry or the Registrar during its TTL; doing so will cancel any current transfer
  - The TAC is created by the registrar but is stored by the registry.
    - When the TAC expires the registry can no longer accept it and a new TAC would need to be generated to initiate a new transfer request

Ensuring the TAC only exists when it's needed helps reduce security risk in case of a data breach or compromise
